Curriculum focus for PPG spending 2015-17

The extra funding has been used to further support and develop existing provision for Physical Education and Healthy Lifestyles.

Staff training continues to be a key means to up-skill staff and ensure all P.E lessons are of a high quality and fully extend all pupils during each lesson. Staff have received INSET for Gymnastics and further INSET is planned in the Summer term 2017.

All classes across school receive multi-skills lessons or a programme called "Wolfie's Workout", 20/30 minute sessions, in addition to their timetabled 2 hours of P.E per week in 2015-16.

Each class in Key stage 2 receive swimming lessons each term:- Y3 – Autumn term, Y4 Spring Term and Y5/6 Summer term. Over the last 2 years we have invested our SPG in additional swimming lessons for those pupils who could not swim at the end of the year. The length of lessons has increased from a half hour to a full hour slot in 2016-17. The additional lessons are one hour per week every term.

A range of Clubs are organised during lunch-times and clubs provided by both school staff and other providers, e.g Tennis, Mixed martial arts and dance.

Use of funding 15-17

- P.E leader to ensure staff have appropriate professional development, monitoring of quality of teaching and learning, and provide school links to PASS coordinator and activities
- Widen range of sports provision and competitions
- Improve assessment of P.E
- Contribute to provision of specialist coaches to support teacher's delivery of PE
- Additional length and quality of swimming lessons

Impact of SPG spending

The school will evaluate the impact on each pupil termly with a pupil participation questionnaire and analysis of pupils who take part in clubs. The School Council also feedback on the effectiveness and popularity of clubs. Data from the Health related Behaviour Survey will inform our actions for future years. Years 3,4,5 and 6 completed the survey in 2014 and again in 2016.

The 2016 Health Related Survey reflects that our Year 4, 5 and 6 pupils feel more engaged and active in Physical activities than other Wolverhampton children. 86% of these pupils rate their physical health as "good" or "excellent" compared to 84% in other Wolverhampton schools. 88% of Graiseley Y4-6 pupils enjoy physical activities at school "quite a lot" or "a lot" compared to 82% in Wolverhampton schools.
